

Division I Recruiting Guidelines

- **ANY TIME:** Prospects can receive non-recruiting materials from college coaches, such as questionnaires, camp brochures and nonathletic institutional publications.
- **June 15 after sophomore year:** Coaches can call prospects and send athletes all forms of private electronic correspondence, including text messages, instant messages, direct messages and emails, as well as all recruiting materials and can also extend verbal scholarship offers.
- Prospects can send emails to coaches at any time; however, coaches cannot respond to emails until June 15th after sophomore year. Therefore, when you send them information include your swing coach/high school coaches' contact information so the coach can contact them.
- If a prospect calls a college coach prior to June 15th after sophomore year the coach cannot have a permissible conversation and cannot return the call if it is missed.
- **August 1 before junior year:** Prospects can begin taking official visits and unofficial visits and can meet with the coach while on campus. Coaches can begin conducting off-campus contact with prospects.
- Prospects can take unlimited unofficial visits after August 1 of the prospect's junior year in high school. An unofficial visit means you pay for the trip.
- The school pays for an official visit. During the junior and senior year, a prospect can take one official visit per school and a total of 5.
- Coaches cannot talk to prospects during tournaments. It is permissible for a coach to use one of their allowed contacts to speak with parents during a tournament if it is after August 1 of the prospect's junior year.
